1. Lift station (175 gpm), pumps, wet well, electrical components, valves, check valves, and related appurtenances.

Attention is called to the fact that not less than, the federally determined prevailing (Davis-Bacon and Related Acts) wage rate, as issued by the Texas Department of Agriculture Office of Rural Affairs and contained in the contract documents, must be paid on this project.
